WHEREAS: The Oregon Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics invites Oregonians to observe

Malnutrition Awareness week and support actions to prevent, identify, educate, treat, and

report disease-related malnutrition; and

WHEREAS: Disease-related malnutrition often goes undetected but is prevalent among vulnerable

populations at any age or body weight, including low-income individuals, communities

of color, and those with chronic illness; and

WHEREAS: Disease-related malnutrition impacts patient health outcomes, leading to higher infection

rates, poor wound healing, longer lengths of stay, and higher frequency of readmission,

and is associated with increased health costs; and

WHEREAS: Action in all settings of care creates opportunities for self-management education and

outpatient interventions to reduce or prevent hospital admissions and readmissions,

reduces post-discharge services, and enables people to remain more independent at home;

and

WHEREAS: The Oregon Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics joins the American Society of Parenteral

and Enteral Nutrition in recognizing Malnutrition Awareness Week to raise awareness

around the important steps that can be taken to prevent and treat disease-related

malnutrition.
